Greenhead Box Traps Status

The Holgate Taxpayers had about 38 green head traps placed in the marsh south of McKinley Ave. and the beach area south of the parking lot. These were effective since they capture the flies as they hatch from the marsh before they fly north.

SUPER STORM SANDY TOTALLY DESTROYED ALL OUR TRAPS.

We have contracted and have completed 27 new traps to place in the marsh. The township will re-deploy the erxisting 60 traps they have by June 15, 2012. We urge all members to buy their own traps and place on your property. Every properly baited trap helps cut down the green head population.
